FALSE ALARM ORDINANCE REQUIREMENTS

Application fees MUST be included with the application. A un-permitted alarm fee may be reduced by contacting our office via phone within 10 days from date of invoice.

• City of Gainesville Burglar Alarm Permits	\$ 18.50 Yearly
• City of Gainesville Fire Alarm Permits	\$ 15.75 Yearly
• Alachua County Burglar Alarm Permit	\$ 15.00 Yearly
• Alachua County Fire Alarm Permit	\$ 15.00 Yearly

1. Every alarm operator must apply annually for a non-transferable permit. Permits are valid for one year from the date of issuance, unless otherwise noted on the permit.
2. Responsibility for false alarms shall be borne by the permit holder.
3. The permit holder shall submit updated application information within fifteen (15) days of when the on-file information has changed.
4. Permits may be revoked if this application contains false information or after the tenth false alarm within a permit year.
5. In addition to other applicable false alarm fees, a fee of \$200 in Alachua County will be assessed if ACFR or ACSO responds to an **un-permitted** false alarm. If GPD responds to an **un-permitted** false alarm, fee is \$231.50. If GFR responds to an **un-permitted** false alarm the fee is \$220.50
6. Alarm systems CANNOT be equipped with an automatic dialing device programmed to connect directly to the Combined Communications Center.
7. Information contained in this application is confidential and exempt from disclosure in accordance with section 281.301 Florida Statutes.

Fire Alarm Ordinances Effective July 1, 2005

Valid Residential Burglar alarm permits will serve as a Dual Permit. ALL Commercial Permits applications must have separate permits for each system in operation.

The above list DOES NOT contain all elements and/or requirements of the Alachua County False Alarm Ordinance, Chapter 121, Articles II and III, Sections 121.50 - 121.65 of the Alachua County Code of Ordinances, or the City of Gainesville's Ordinance 0-00-36 and City of Gainesville's Ordinance Chapter 10 Article IV.
